KILLED IN ACTION.

PRIVATE BEBBINGTON.—Mrs. M. W. Bebbington, of 18 Railway-street, Cook's Hill, has been advised that her son, Private George Bebbington, was killed in action on October 8, 1917. It was previously stated that he had been missing since October 4th, 1917. Private Bebbington sailed with reinforcements on November 11, 1916, and at the time of his death was attached to a Lewis machine gun section.

DIED OF WOUNDS.

PRIVATE GORDON.—Mr. and Mrs. Gordon, of Waralah-road, Broadmeadow, have received information that their son, Private Robert ("Scotchie") Gordon, has died of wounds on March 22, 1918, in France. Private Gordon, before enlisting was employed by the A.A. Company, and lived in Railway-street, Cook's Hill.
