forced them also to withdraw and as 2nd Lt. Murdoch had been pinned and wounded twice he had to go to the Aid Post - Cpl. Cameron returned to the remainder of the men and started consolidating with the 2nd Border Regt on our original front line which he carried out successfully and held on till reinforcements came. Relief came at night and we returned to Bois Camp near VESTRAT Casualties. Killed Cpl. M. Graham M. 6 2nd Lieut. G. O. Anderson. A Brown, K. S. Dobie, wounded Cpl. W. Rennie 2nd Lieut. A. C.
