100 Policemen Wounded. Berlin, Wednesday. The reports of last night's riot fill columns in this morning's papers, and rarely has such a series of attacks and encounters in the Berlin streets been chronicled. The mob assumed the aggressive, using swords, beer jugs, and other articles as weapons, while many of the men had protruding their heads from the windows of the houses, and were firing indiscriminately at people appearing in the streets.
